



Nordonia High School Advisory/Extended Homeroom Period

Purpose - a time of day to intentionally complete needed tasks, build relationships with students and support student's long term academic needs.

- *Placement in the day- between 2nd and 3rd period*
- *21 minutes in length*
- *Building-wide announcements will be shared at this time*
- *Students divided by grade level*
- *All teachers have approximately 15 students, randomly assigned*

Many activities will be completed during the Advisory/Extended Homeroom time:

- 1) *Students will be able to check grades, check Google classroom and general assignments, plan the week while reviewing school, athletics, and club meetings.*
- 2) *Guidance Counselor touch base time -complete information in School Links; complete guidance lessons; address study skills; college/career exploration; complete skills inventories; and review scheduling information at semester change.*
- 3) *Complete themed Mindsets lessons. (one advisory period –may overlap into the next day if lesson is not completed)*
- 4) *Conduct class meetings, pep rallies, and other academically focused grade level assemblies.*
- 5) *Celebrate student milestones. (i.e. birthdays, awards, etc)*
- 6) *Additional activities may be added to this list as the year unfolds.*

Our high school staff is committed to building a positive school culture and climate while building positive relationships with students. Long term goals of our advisory period include reducing behavioral incidents, increasing the likelihood of early academic intervention, and increasing student achievement overall !
