#### Scholarsip/Financial Aid Resources

#### FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

All students/families should fill out the FAFSA (even if you don't think you'll qualify for grants) as soon as possible after it becomes available in **December this year**. You need to fill out the FAFSA to be eligible for federal financial aid but also, some schools require you to have a FAFSA on file just to receive their scholarships. Also, you never know when your financial situation may change between now and when you start college. It is best to have this application on file just in case.

On or as soon as possible in December, go to: <u>fafsa.gov</u>



If you need assistance, you may contact the Financial Aid Dept. at any college/university you are applying to. Also, plan on attending the info. meeting at NHS Monday, November 6th.

#### **CSS** Profile

Some colleges and universities use the CSS Profile to award financial aid. This is an online application used by colleges, universities and scholarship programs to award non-federal financial aid such as grants and scholarships. The CSS Profile is a separate application from the FAFSA and should be completed in addition to the FAFSA not in place of the FAFSA. The application is available October 1st each year. <u>https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/</u>

#### Merit Scholarships - From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To

Merit scholarships are often related to academic performance, but can also be given to a candidate displaying artistic or athletic excellence, or even a combination of both. While all academic scholarships are merit scholarships, not all merit scholarships are academic.

Often all you have to do is apply to the school to be considered for merit scholarships to attend that school. You'll automatically be considered (typically GPA, test scores on ACT/SAT, and/or class rank) once you submit your college application. However, some schools do require an additional application Do your research to find out and also be mindful of deadlines!

Also, make sure you check the college/university website directly for any additional scholarships they offer that require a separate application and deadline. Many schools advertise additional scholarships in this way.

#### Website Scholarships - From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To

You should carefully research the website from all schools you are applying to. They may have additional scholarships listed that you can apply for separately.

#### Local Scholarships - Nordonia Students Only

Local scholarships will be introduced to all current Nordonia High School seniors during the month of February. Students will be able to access the application materials online and must submit all printed copies to the Guidance Office. More information and deadlines to come.

#### Private Scholarship Resources

Did you know you may be able to get more money from your dream college? Going Merry just released an Appeal Letter Generator to assist you in generating an appeal letter in 4 simple steps.

A financial aid appeal letter is a formal request asking a school to reconsider its decision on your financial aid. The letter is a chance to explain a unique circumstance, financial situation, and anything else that has changed since you submitted the FAFSA®. Here are some common reasons students (like yourself), should consider submitting an appeal letter.

> You got admitted, but it's not enough. You received a better offer at another school. Your FAFSA® didn't reflect some nuanced financial situation. Your financial circumstances have changed. You made a mistake (or multiple) on your FAFSA®.

You will only know if you are eligible for additional free money if you ask! Here are your next steps to begin this process.

# **6tips** you should know before making the olg decision



#### 1. The acronyms you need to know

- **Cost of attendance (COA):** an estimate of what one full year of school will cost. It includes tuition, along with housing, meals, fees, books, and more. Check your school's website for a detailed COA.
- Student Aid Index (SAI): an index number the U.S. Department of Education and schools use to determine what types, and how much, financial aid you could get. The amount you actually pay may be different.

#### 2. You might get a few types of financial aid

- Scholarships and grants: free money that you won't have to pay back—seriously!
- **Work-study:** money you earn by working a part-time job through your school
- Loans: money you can borrow that you will have to pay back with interest

#### 3. Remember this equation

#### COA – financial aid = what's left to pay

Do this equation for every school on your list. If you still owe money, you may need to use savings, private student loans, or other sources to cover the difference.

#### 4. Hold on: don't just pick the biggest offer

A small financial aid offer with more free money may be better than a larger offer with more loans. Why? Because you'll have to pay back those loans with interest.

#### 5. Read the fine print

Before you pick your offer, pay attention to the conditions. Some types of financial aid may be renewable, and some may be for one year only. Also, some scholarships might require you to maintain a certain GPA.

#### 6. Choose what works for you

You don't have to accept all the aid listed in your financial aid offer. Pick the types and amounts of aid you need, and make sure to respond before the deadline.

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# Compare your financial aid offers

After you've filed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®), any colleges that you included on your information and have accepted you will use your FAFSA® to calculate your financial aid. They'll follow up with a financial aid offer that includes the financial aid that's being offered to you. This can help you get an idea of what each college may cost you—and start the discussion of how you'll pay any remaining costs.

Line up how much financial aid you're getting in grants, scholarships, work-study, and federal student loans from each school. Once you know the amount of financial aid you're eligible for from a school, you want to subtract that number from the cost of attendance. The remainder is sometimes called "the gap" or your out-of-pocket costs. It's the amount you may need to pay on your own—by using your income, savings, a 529 savings account, a tuition payment plan, finding more scholarships, or taking out private student loans.

April Highlights:

• Decision Day has changed from May 1 to June 1. If your admitted students decide to become a Golden Flash before June 1, we encourage them to officially commit as soon as possible so they can apply for housing and register for summer orientation called Destination Kent State (DKS).

• FAFSA: The Kent State University Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid is starting to receive FAFSA applications from Federal Student Aid. They will be sharing updates with students via email as they receive them, and will continue to post <u>updates on their website</u>.

Financial Aid plans to begin sending Offer Letters to new students in April!

• Admitted Student Next Steps: Admitted students can apply for on-campus housing and DKS summer orientation after submitting their enrollment fee through FlashLine.

• Admitted Student Events: We have a great lineup of events for admitted students this spring, including admitted student campus tours, virtual next steps events and 30-minute Flash Topics. Students can register in their <u>applicant portal</u> and can learn more on our webpage.

• KSU ZeeMee Chat Community: Admitted KSU students can join over 4,000 fellow Future Flashes in our private chat community on ZeeMee. Students can take the roommate quiz to find their best match for on-campus housing and make friends before the start of the semester!

• Custom Viewbook: Are your juniors beginning to explore colleges? Have them create a Custom Viewbook where they can mix and match their favorite academic programs and areas of student life to create a personalized KSU virtual booklet.



I have some updates that might be helpful as you work with students and their families.

First, students who were admitted to BGSU will begin to receive through the mail a comprehensive guide to investing in higher education. It will include information about our locked-in prices, installment payment plans, working on campus, low-interest loan opportunities, the BG Promise and other reasons to choose a Falcon future.

This is well-timed because BGSU has started to receive student data from the 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). It will take several weeks for the U.S. Department of Education to send us the bulk of the student records, especially since some of the data has been wrong and needs to be corrected by the U.S. Department of Education.

However, as we receive this information, we will begin pulling that data into our system, which is a layered process. Our next step will be to determine and finalize financial aid offers by late April as long as we keep receiving accurate data from the U.S. Department of Education. Our decision deadline remains May 15 for those who want to select their housing May 20-22, but students can commit to BGSU throughout the summer, a process that has been in place at BGSU for years.

A few helpful notes:

As the U.S. Department of Education processes FAFSAs, they will email students with confirmation. This does not mean that BGSU will be able to tell a student we have it yet. In a few weeks, we hope to send our own confirmation email that acknowledges receipt of a student's FAFSA. Students who filed the FAFSA and made a mistake will not be able to make corrections until later in April, per the U.S. Department of Education. The same goes for those who filed the FAFSA and now want to add BGSU as a recipient of their data. Our best advice for students is to remain patient, even though this is frustrating. We will always have room for anyone who wants to attend. Please encourage prospective students to file the 2024-2025 FAFSA, which allows students to be considered for federal and state grants based on financial need. Regardless of income, students will also receive an offer for low-interest loans, which can be put toward tuition, living on campus, a meal plan, laptop and books.

#### **Important FAFSA update** Ohio State is anxiously awaiting FAFSA recor

Ohio State is anxiously awaiting FAFSA records from the Department of Education. Once those records are received, we will work quickly to process them and release financial aid notifications. Based on the information we have today, we still anticipate sending financial aid notifications in April.

#### Next steps for students who have said "yes" to Ohio State

As we begin sending important enrollment communications to admitted students, here are some quick reminders to share with them:

- Activate and regularly check your Ohio State BuckeyeMail account. Important information about housing, orientation and financial aid is sent only to that inbox.
- Housing contracts are sent each Friday in the order that students paid their acceptance fee. You have two weeks to complete your contract. All students are required to live in university housing unless they are living at home or with a close relative. You must complete an <u>approved</u> <u>exception form</u> to live outside of university housing.
- We'll start sending orientation registration information at the end of March to students who have paid an acceptance fee.

#### Living-learning communities deadline: April 15


Ohio State offers 15 <u>living-learning communities</u> for incoming first-year students to consider. A living-learning community is a group of students with a common major, career and/or personal interest who live together on a residence hall floor.

Through partnerships with a variety of academic departments, faculty and staff, students have exclusive access to activities that tie directly into their academic success at Ohio State.

#### Reminder of our regional campus pathway

## EXPLORATION PLAN

As Exploratory students, you will benefit from the guidance and support offered by expert Academic Advisors through your personalized Exploration Plan. The Exploration Plan consisting of 6 key components including:

#### 1. SELECTING AN AREA OF INTEREST

Selecting one of 13 areas of interest to begin exploring. This is your first step and will be completed before you begin your first semester.

#### 2. MAJOR ACTION PLAN

Creating a Major Action Plan (MAP) using the results of your career readiness inventory, you will utilize your MAP with an Academic Advisor until you declare your major.

#### 3. FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE COURSE

Engaging in the First Year Experience course (UC 10097), which will focus on your transition to college, making connections with your peers and resources, learning about your personal preferences, engaging in your exploration, and much more.

#### 4. COURSEWORK WITH PEERS

Enrolling in a course with other first-year Exploratory students, providing you with the opportunity to network with your peers and create study groups. Some of the courses include experiential learning components, which promote academic relevance, meaning and an understanding of real-world issues.

#### 5. CAREER NAVIGATION

Enrolling in the Career Navigation: Constructing the Possibilities course (UC 20010) during the second semester. In this course, you will learn more about your interests and strengths, make connections, and set career related goals.

#### 6. EXPLORATORY LEARNING COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

Joining the Exploratory Learning Community is encouraged. It is a great way to build connections with your peers and gain access to more support through your career and major exploration! Open to all first-year Exploratory students living in Lake Hall, Honors students living in Honors housing, or students commuting to campus.
