Course Planning

The Nordonia High School curriculum contains a wide variety of courses. A descriptive paragraph summarizes course content. Specific prerequisites are also listed so that you know if you qualify to take a particular class. It is not always an easy task to decide which courses should be chosen and in what sequential order they should be taken. Course planning decisions <u>must</u> involve you the student, your parents, your teachers, and your school counselor.

Many of the courses at Nordonia are open to all students during the four years of attendance, however some are not. Please pay particular attention to the grade levels listed that are permitted to take each course. Your teachers will recommend specific courses for you depending upon assessed academic potential and past academic records.

In February, registration materials are made available for students to use when selecting courses to be taken during the next school year. Your proposed courses for next year must be reviewed by your parents, teachers, and your school counselor.

It is important to stress the seriousness of February registration. The complexity of scheduling for a school the size of Nordonia requires an early and accurate collection of student course information. The careful, timely planning of a schedule, gives a student the opportunity to select courses they are best suited for and interested in.

Procedures for Course Registration

The following steps will be taken to schedule students for classes at Nordonia High School:

- 1. Group scheduling meetings will be held for all students grades 8-11
- 2. Individual conference with a counselor if needed.
- 3. Parent and student signatures are required on course selection sheet.
- 4. Instructor approval is required for English, math, science, social studies, Computer Maintenance & Repair, Choir, Student Council, Library Ambassador, Yearbook, Media Production, and Band.

Schedule Change Requests

During the time between course registration (February) and the start of the school year (late August) students and parents may elect to change a student's schedule for the next school year. After the start of the school year, course changes will only be made if:

- 1) There is a scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
- 2) Changes are necessitated by failures.
- 3) Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school requires a change.
- 4) A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's request.

Schedule changing <u>after</u> the school year has begun are <u>not permitted</u> since a student's schedule is the result of careful planning by the student, their counselor, their teachers, and their parents, and critical staffing decisions were based on the student's course selections.

Changing Course Levels

A student may move from one course to a more or less difficult one within a discipline through teacher recommendation only. Students should first demonstrate that they have completed all homework and sought additional help from the teacher or tutor. The teacher may initiate a level change at any time during the semester if the teacher feels the change is appropriate due to academic misplacement, and after communication with the student's parents and counselor.

Early Release

Students who receive their schedules and have a 7th period study hall, may fill out the Early Release Permission Form and submit to the main office. This will allow them to leave school after 6th period. Students are not permitted to rearrange schedules for Early Release.

Class Placement

Students are promoted to grade levels based on the number of credits they accumulate per year.

2. SHOW COMPETENCY

- End-of-Course Exams (AIR Tests)
 - Students will take the following EOCEs: Algebra I, Biology, English II, Geometry, US History, Government
 - Students need to earn a competency score of 684 on both the English II and Algebra I EOCE
 - Students who do not pass the test(s) will be offered additional support and must retake the test(s). If the testing requirements are not met, there are 4 additional ways to show competency:
 - 1. Demonstrate 2 Career Focused Activities*
 - 2. Enlist in the military*
 - 3. Complete College Course work through the College Credit Plus Program*
 - 4. Earn a remediation free score on the ACT/SAT

3. SHOW READINESS

- Earn 2 diploma seals out of the 12 seals offered, criteria is outlined in the student handbook.

4. COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

Students need to document 20 hours of community service. Hours can begin to be accumulated the summer after 8th grade (20 hours also earns a student the Local Community Service Diploma Seal).

Competency and Readiness requirements will be explained and shared in more detail in high school.

PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETING SCHEDULING WORKSHEET GRADE 12 FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

- 1. Complete name and telephone information.
- 2. Circle the course number in each required academic area as well as elective courses.

Note: Seniors must take credits in each of the following academic areas:

• 1 FULL credit English

NOTE: 1/2 credit English electives CANNOT BE used for the 4th year graduation requirement.

- 1 Math credit (if you have not completed 4)
- 4 FULL Elective credits (total must pair ½ credit courses)
- Note: CVCC students have 3 periods at the HS.
- Note: Students registering for College Writing I/II, Gen. Chem. I/I, or Black Experience I/II I are permitted to take 2 study halls each semester
- Seniors may request a 7th period early release by completing the Senior Experience Google Form and requesting "Senior Experience" on their request sheet. Senior Experience counts as one of your allowed study halls.
- 3. Scheduling Worksheet <u>must</u> have a teacher recommendation (initials) for all academic courses, foreign language, and any elective with a signature line next to it.
- 4. Student and parent must sign the Scheduling Worksheet.
- 5. All students must be registered for 6 classes <u>each</u> semester.
- 6. Schedules may be changed by contacting your current NHS Counselor <u>before the first</u> <u>day of school. Schedule changes after the start of school are not permitted.</u>


Athletic Eligibility Note: Students must be passing five courses each semester.
