Course Planning

The Nordon High School curriculum contains a wide variety of courses. A descriptive paragraph summarizes course content. Specific prerequisites are also listed so that you know if you qualify to take a particular class. It is not always an easy task to decide which courses should be chosen and in what sequential order they should be taken. Course planning decisions must involve you, the student, your parents, your teachers, and your school counselor.

Many of the courses at Nordon are open to all students during the four years of attendance, however some are not. Please pay particular attention to the grade levels listed that are permitted to take each course. Your teachers will recommend specific courses for you depending upon assessed academic potential and past academic records.

In February, registration materials are made available for students to use when selecting courses to be taken during the next school year. Your proposed courses for next year must be reviewed by your parents, teachers, and your school counselor.

It is important to stress the seriousness of February registration. The complexity of scheduling for a school the size of Nordon requires an early and accurate collection of student course information. The careful, timely planning of a schedule, gives a student the opportunity to select courses they are best suited for and interested in.

Procedures for Course Registration

The following steps will be taken to schedule students for classes at Nordon High School:

1. Group scheduling meetings will be held for all students grades 8 – 11
2. Individual conference with a counselor if needed.
3. Parent and student signatures are required on course selection sheet.
4. Instructor approval is required for English, math, science, social studies, Computer Maintenance & Repair, Choir, Student Council, Library Ambassador, Yearbook, Media Production, and Band.

Schedule Change Requests

During the time between course registration (February) and the start of the school year (late August) students and parents may elect to change a student's schedule for the next school year. After the start of the school year, course changes will only be made if:

- 1) There is a scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
- 2) Changes are necessitated by failures.
- 3) Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school requires a change.
- 4) A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's request.

Schedule changing after the school year has begun are not permitted since a student's schedule is the result of careful planning by the student, their counselor, their teachers, and their parents, and critical staffing decisions were based on the student's course selections.

Changing Course Levels

A student may move from one course to a more or less difficult one within a discipline through teacher recommendation only. Students should first demonstrate that they have completed all homework and sought additional help from the teacher or tutor. The teacher may initiate a level change at any time during the semester if the teacher feels the change is appropriate due to academic misplacement, and after communication with the student's parents and counselor.

Early Release

Students who receive their schedules and have a 7th period study hall, may fill out the Early Release Permission Form and submit to the main office. This will allow them to leave school after 6th period. Students are not permitted to rearrange schedules for Early Release.

Class Placement

Students are promoted to grade levels based on the number of credits they accumulate per year.

2. SHOW COMPETENCY*

- Students who do not pass the test(s) will be offered additional support and must retake the test.

- 3. Complete College Course work through the College Credit Plus Program*

4. COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

Students need to document 20 hours of community service. Hours can begin to be accumulated the summer after 8th grade (these can also be used towards the hours needed for the Community Service Seal in step 3).

**PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETING SCHEDULING WORKSHEET
GRADE 11
FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR**

1. Complete name and telephone information.
2. Circle the course number in each required academic area as well as elective courses.

Note: Juniors must take credits in each of the following academic areas:

- 1 credit English
- 1 credit Math
- 1 credit Science (typically Chemistry or Environmental Science)
- 1 credit Social Studies (typically both Government and Financial Literacy/Economics)
- 2 Elective credits (can be combination, but must total at least 2 full periods)

3. Scheduling Worksheet **must** have a **teacher recommendation** (initials) for all academic courses, foreign language, and any elective with a signature line next to it.
4. Student and parent **must** sign the Scheduling Worksheet.
5. All students must be registered for at least 6 classes each semester. **Students that are applying to CVCC should register for their 1st choice program and 3 full core academic periods (English, Math, Gov/Econ) at NHS.** If your CVCC program includes an English or math course at CVCC, you should then request your last science credit within your NHS schedule.
6. Schedules may be changed by contacting NHS Support Services **before the first day of school. Schedule changes after the start of school are not permitted.**

Athletic Eligibility Note: Students must be passing five courses each semester. Physical Education is .25 credit and does not apply toward eligibility. Please be aware of grades in order to remain eligible to participate in athletic programs.

STUDENT DECISION TREE

This decision tree shows alignment between majors/careers and high school math pathways' courses. The information is broad and should be used for general guidance only, as alignments may vary by higher education institutions. Please check your local community colleges or four-year feeder schools and adjust the chart as necessary.

For their third unit of mathematics, students may wish to explore one of their new pathway courses such as Math Modeling and Reasoning, Data Science Foundations or Computer Science/Discrete Math. However, if students decide to pursue a major within that pathway that may require Calculus, they should take Algebra 2 for their fourth unit of mathematics. Students who wish to take AP Statistics and may need Calculus for their major should take Algebra 2 (6 – 12 Education with a math or science concentration, Business Intelligence, Information Science*, Statistics). Students whose major will not require Calculus can select their pathway (Algebra 2, Data Science Foundations, or Math Modeling & Reasoning are recommended).

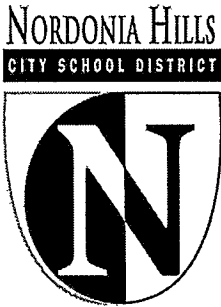
