School/Career Visitations:

Planning on visiting a college?

Stop into the Support Services Office prior to your planned visit & pick up a <u>School/Career Visitation Form</u>.

This form MUST be completed, signed by a representative from your visit as well as a parent/guardian.

Return to the main office on the next School Day.

A parent MUST call you in absent the day of your visit.

Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students

STEP 1: Apply

Complete college applications using **ONE** method below (use a personal email NOT your NHS email for applications. Communication from outside organizations are blocked by the District).

• Online application - Access the application directly from the college website

- **Common App** Some Colleges are CommonApp exclusive and some give you the option to use the Common App or their own online applications.
- Register for an account at <u>www.commonapp.org</u>
- Complete/input all information for all sections and sign the FERPA waiver
 *Please Note: Schools ask for a <u>Counselor Rec.</u>, this is not the same as requesting a letter of rec. I complete/send a Common App Counselor Rec.
 & School Report automatically for all Common Apps you submit.
- Check for the following for each college: application fee, deadline, essay, # of required/optional recommendations, separate scholarship or honors applications required, etc.

<u>PLEASE BE SURE TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION BEFORE MOVING TO NEXT STEPS</u>

If you need or want to request a letter of recommendation, you will need to move to Step 2 before you submit your application to the college/university.

STEP 2: <u>Requesting High School Materials</u> (completed through SchooLinks - login through Clever)

College Application Manager in SchooLinks:

Using the "Colleges" tab on the left hand side of your screen, select "College Applications" from the list.

- The first time you use the College Application Manager, you will enter your personal information (address, phone number, personal email-you must remove your Nordonia email and enter your personal email) and indicate preference of Financial Aid/need as well as sign the FERPA Waiver again.
- For each college you'd like to apply to (that is not CommonApp), you'll need to set up an application and its requirements <u>follow the steps below (Non-Common App Colleges) to add applications to your College</u> <u>Application Manager</u>.

Common App Colleges:

 Connect your Common App to SchooLinks. Once logged in to SchooLinks, in the College Application Manager, click the blue "connect" button under the Common App icon, follow prompts to connect accounts. Once linked, click the blue "FERPA Waiver" button below the Common App icon if prompted. Your applications on Common App will automatically be added to the dashboard. If you've submitted your applications, they will appear under the "Completed & Pending" column. If your applications have not been submitted, they will appear under the "Incomplete" column (this will allow you to request letters of recommendation - see steps on back).



Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students - Continued

Non-Common App Colleges: From your application dashboard follow these instructions to add colleges you're applying to:

- Click on + Add application in the upper right hand corner to look up a college
 - Search and select the college/campus you are applying to and choose the application status either: "In Progress" (you haven't sent the application) or "Completed and Pending"
- Application Method: choose "School-specific online app"
- Application Type: choose type/deadline you used
- Student Requirements: Financial Aid & Scores & Performance check any that apply to you
- Click on ✓ Save Application
- Check the details of your application from the final screen to determine if the information is correct

STEP 3: Sending High School Materials - YOU ARE NOT FINISHED UNTIL YOU COMPLETE THIS STEP!

Once you submit your application, you <u>MUST</u> visit Ms. Volin in Support Services.
 You transcripts and important documents will not be sent until you do.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

From your College Application dashboard, select a college application by clicking on the pencil icon Ø

Teacher recommendation requests are located in the middle column of the individual college's application page. There will be details regarding the college's recommendation requirements. If there are no required letters, it may still give you the option to submit an optional recommendation.

To add an optional recommendation follow these steps:

- · Click on the + sign next to "Request Teacher Evaluation"
- Search and select the teacher in the list provided and hit "Next" (If you are asking a non-teacher, once you start typing the name, you can click on "Don't see your teacher listed? Add them manually" and add the name and email of the individual you are asking.
- Check the information is accurate for the teacher you are inviting to complete a recommendation letter. Select the Subject area they teach or select other if it is not a traditional teacher.
- Create a custom message to the teacher regarding what college(s) you're applying to, anything you would ask them to highlight, let them know if you've completed the brag sheet.
- Click "Submit Request" and follow up with the teacher in person.

Required recommendation letters:

- Click the + next to "Add Recommender" (there will be a red exclamation mark that says "required" in a red box indicating that you must submit the number of letter of recommendation boxes listed).
- Follow the steps above to complete the recommendation request.

please provide AT LEAST a 2 week notice when inviting teachers to complete a letter of rec

<u>Complete Recommendation Letter Brag Sheet and Profile/Resume in SchooLinks</u> (2 options - teachers may want you to complete BOTH)

Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students - Continued

Option 1:

- Click on Home/Dashboard
- Click on "To-Do List", search for "Recommendation Letter Brag Sheet" due September 29th, and click on item and then click on the green "Go to feature" box
- Complete all information and click the blue "Submit" button

Option 2:

- . Click on the "Careers" tab on the left hand side and select "My Profile/Resume"
- Click on each section (My Story, Experience, Bragging Rights, & Academics) across the top. Be sure to complete each section fully to highlight your goals, skills, extracurriculars, awards and recognitions. Teachers will use this section to write your recommendation letters.

Tracking Letters of Recommendation

- In College Application Manager, under Recommendation Tracker (left column), click on "View all Requests"
- You will see a list of the letters and evaluations grouped by the Teacher giving the evaluation. If the teacher has been assigned to multiple colleges, you can click Show at the right end of the bar for the teacher to expand details.
- Each recommendation letter and evaluation will show one of the following three statuses:
 - Request Pending: The recommender has been requested to submit an evaluation or recommendation which has not been submitted yet.
 - Request Fulfilled: The recommender has submitted the requested evaluation or recommendation, which has been transmitted to the destination institution(s).
 - Declined: The recommender has been requested to submit an evaluation and has declined to do so.
 Another recommender will need to be selected by changing the evaluation request.





Scholarsip/Financial Aid Resources

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

All students/families should fill out the FAFSA (even if you don't think you'll qualify for grants) as soon as possible after it becomes available in **December this year**. You need to fill out the FAFSA to be eligible for federal financial aid but also, some schools require you to have a FAFSA on file just to receive their scholarships. Also, you never know when your financial situation may change between now and when you start college. It is best to have this application on file just in case.

On or as soon as possible in December, go to: fafsa.gov

If you need assistance, you may contact the Financial Aid Dept. at any college/university you are applying to. Also, plan on attending the info. meeting at NHS Monday, November 6th.

CSS Profile

Some colleges and universities use the CSS Profile to award financial aid. This is an online application used by colleges, universities and scholarship programs to award non-federal financial aid such as grants and scholarships. The CSS Profile is a separate application from the FAFSA and should be completed in addition to the FAFSA not in place of the FAFSA. The application is available October 1st each year. <u>https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/</u>

<u>Merit Scholarships – From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To</u>

Merit scholarships are often related to academic performance, but can also be given to a candidate displaying artistic or athletic excellence, or even a combination of both. While all academic scholarships are merit scholarships, not all merit scholarships are academic.

Often all you have to do is apply to the school to be considered for merit scholarships to attend that school. You'll automatically be considered (typically GPA, test scores on ACT/SAT, and/or class rank) once you submit your college application. However, some schools do require an additional application Do your research to find out and also be mindful of deadlines!

Also, make sure you check the college/university website directly for any additional scholarships they offer that require a separate application and deadline. Many schools advertise additional scholarships in this way.

Website Scholarships – From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To

You should carefully research the website from all schools you are applying to. They may have additional scholarships listed that you can apply for separately.

Local Scholarships - Nordonia Students Only

Local scholarships will be introduced to all current Nordonia High School seniors during the month of February. Students will be able to access the application materials online and must submit all printed copies to the Guidance Office. More information and deadlines to come.

Updates on our early action applicants

As the Nov. 1 early action deadline has passed, we've received nearly 57,000 applications to date, a 4.8% increase over this time last year.

We received 29,590 applications in the week around Nov. 1, so we'll need some additional time to match application materials with applications.

Our first application incomplete reminder comes about two weeks after the application is submitted. Students can continue to check their application status at <u>appstatus.osu.edu</u>.

Our decision release timeline

With our early action deadline now passed, we're just a few weeks away from our first decision release:

- Early action: December 8 and January 19
- Regular decision (due by February 1): February 16 and March 22

<u>Reminder</u>: We'll release both admit and deny decisions on December 8, but we will not be releasing defer decisions until January 19.

Please let your students know that applications flow through our review process individually, so if they don't hear back at the same time as a friend, they might still be admitted later.

Note for Honors and Scholars applicants: We'll begin sending invitations to join Honors or Scholars on December 15 – and invitations will continue to be sent every three to four weeks.

Note for Morrill Scholarship Program applicants: We'll begin sending decisions on January 5 – and decisions will be sent on a rolling basis every two weeks through the end of March.

Free application to our region campuses until December 15th

We're committed to keeping Ohio State affordable for all Ohio students. Through December 15, students can enter this fee waiver **code UFWREG4** in their online application to one of our regional campuses in Lima, Mansfield, Marion, Newark and Wooster.

*This code is exclusively available for our regional campus applications and does not apply to the Columbus campus.

FAFSA Priority Deadline: February 15th

The FAFSA is slated to open in December. As soon as it's available, your students are encouraged to complete it to be considered for the most aid.

Additionally, students are encouraged to log into our scholarship-matching platform, <u>ScholarshipUniverse</u>, to create a profile and start matching with scholarships!

Our priority deadline for both is February 15, 2024.



We hope the school year has been going well so far! We are excited to share that students' interest in The University of Akron continues to rise, and we have seen a dramatic increase of applications this fall. We are still accepting new applications for the fall 2024 term and are continuing to automatically waive every student's application fee.



Please keep these important dates in mind as you help guide your students through the college admission process:

- Late November: Admitted students will begin receiving merit scholarship notifications.
- December: 2024-25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) becomes available, with significant changes to the application process, eligibility and aid calculation.
- **Feb. 1**: Recommended deadline for filing the FAFSA.
- Late February: Admitted students will begin receiving financial aid offers.
- May 1: Deadline to confirm enrollment.



As Exploratory students, you will benefit from the guidance and support offered by expert Academic Advisors through your personalized Exploration Plan. The Exploration Plan consisting of 6 key components including:

1. SELECTING AN AREA OF INTEREST

Selecting one of 13 areas of interest to begin exploring. This is your first step and will be completed before you begin your first semester.

2. MAJOR ACTION PLAN

Creating a Major Action Plan (MAP) using the results of your career readiness inventory, you will utilize your MAP with an Academic Advisor until you declare your major.

3. FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE COURSE

Engaging in the First Year Experience course (UC 10097), which will focus on your transition to college, making connections with your peers and resources, learning about your personal preferences, engaging in your exploration, and much more.

4. COURSEWORK WITH PEERS

Enrolling in a course with other first-year Exploratory students, providing you with the opportunity to network with your peers and create study groups. Some of the courses include experiential learning components, which promote academic relevance, meaning and an understanding of real-world issues.

5. CAREER NAVIGATION

Enrolling in the Career Navigation: Constructing the Possibilities course (UC 20010) during the second semester. In this course, you will learn more about your interests and strengths, make connections, and set career related goals.






