Student Services Information

- 1. Check the bulletin board in the 300 hallway for all the latest information on your many college choices!
- 2. <u>School/Career Visitations</u>: Planning on visiting a college? Stop into the Support Services Office prior to your planned visit & pick up a School/Career Visitation Form. This form MUST be completed, signed by a representative from your visit as well as a parent/guardian. Return to the main office on the next School Day. A parent MUST call you in absent the day of your visit.



Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students

STEP 1: Apply

Complete college applications using **ONE** method below (use a personal email NOT your NHS email for applications. Communication from outside organizations are blocked by the District).

- Online application Access the application directly from the college website
 OR
 - Common App- Some Colleges are CommonApp exclusive and some give you the option to use the Common App or their own online applications.
 - · Register for an account at www.commonapp.org
 - Complete/input all information for all sections and sign the FERPA waiver
 *Please Note: Schools ask for a <u>Counselor Rec.</u>, this is not the same as requesting a letter of rec. I complete/send a Common App Counselor Rec.
 & School Report automatically for all Common Apps you submit.
 - Check for the following for each college: application fee, deadline, essay, # of required/optional recommendations, separate scholarship or honors applications required, etc.

<u>PLEASE BE SURE TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION BEFORE MOVING TO NEXT STEPS</u>

If you need or want to request a letter of recommendation, you will need to move to Step 2 before you submit your application to the college/university.

STEP 2: Requesting High School Materials (completed through School inks - login through Clever)

College Application Manager in SchooLinks:

Using the "Colleges" tab on the left hand side of your screen, select "College Applications" from the list.

- The first time you use the College Application Manager, you will enter your personal information (address, phone number, personal email-you must remove your Nordonia email and enter your personal email) and indicate preference of Financial Aid/need as well as sign the FERPA Waiver again.
- For each college you'd like to apply to (that is not CommonApp), you'll need to set up an application and its requirements follow the steps below (Non-Common App Colleges) to add applications to your College Application Manager.

Common App Colleges:

Connect your Common App to SchooLinks. Once logged in to SchooLinks, in the College Application
Manager, click the blue "connect" button under the Common App icon, follow prompts to connect accounts.
Once linked, click the blue "FERPA Waiver" button below the Common App icon if prompted.
Your applications on Common App will automatically be added to the dashboard. If you've submitted your applications, they will appear under the "Completed & Pending" column. If your applications have not been submitted, they will appear under the "Incomplete" column (this will allow you to request letters of recommendation - see steps on back).



Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students - Continued

Non-Common App Colleges:

From your application dashboard follow these instructions to add colleges you're applying to:

- Click on + Add application in the upper right hand corner to look up a college
 - Search and select the college/campus you are applying to and choose the application status either:
 - "In Progress" (you haven't sent the application) or "Completed and Pending"
- Application Method: choose "School-specific online app"
- · Application Type: choose type/deadline you used
- Student Requirements: Financial Aid & Scores & Performance check any that apply to you
- Click on
 √ Save Application
- Check the details of your application from the final screen to determine if the information is correct

STEP 3: Sending High School Materials - YOU ARE NOT FINISHED UNTIL YOU COMPLETE THIS STEP!

Once you submit your application, you <u>MUST</u> visit Ms. Volin in Support Services.
 You transcripts and important documents will not be sent until you do.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Teacher recommendation requests are located in the middle column of the individual college's application page. There will be details regarding the college's recommendation requirements. If there are no required letters, it may still give you the option to submit an optional recommendation.

To add an optional recommendation follow these steps:

- Click on the + sign next to "Request Teacher Evaluation"
- Search and select the teacher in the list provided and hit "Next" (If you are asking a non-teacher, once you start typing the name, you can click on "Don't see your teacher listed? Add them manually" and add the name and email of the individual you are asking.
- Check the information is accurate for the teacher you are inviting to complete a recommendation letter. Select the Subject area they teach or select other if it is not a traditional teacher.
- Create a custom message to the teacher regarding what college(s) you're applying to, anything you would ask them to highlight, let them know if you've completed the brag sheet.
- Click "Submit Request" and follow up with the teacher in person.

Required recommendation letters:

- Click the + next to "Add Recommender" (there will be a red exclamation mark that says "required" in a red box indicating that you must submit the number of letter of recommendation boxes listed).
- Follow the steps above to complete the recommendation request.

Procedures for Completing College Applications for Students - Continued

Option 1:

- Click on Home/Dashboard
- Click on "To-Do List", search for "Recommendation Letter Brag Sheet" due September 29th, and click on item and then click on the green "Go to feature" box
- Complete all information and click the blue "Submit" button

Option 2:

- · Click on the "Careers" tab on the left hand side and select "My Profile/Resume"
- Click on each section (My Story, Experience, Bragging Rights, & Academics) across the top. Be sure to complete each section fully to highlight your goals, skills, extracurriculars, awards and recognitions.
 Teachers will use this section to write your recommendation letters.

<u>Tracking Letters of Recommendation</u>

- In College Application Manager, under Recommendation Tracker (left column), click on "View all Requests"
- You will see a list of the letters and evaluations grouped by the Teacher giving the evaluation. If the teacher
 has been assigned to multiple colleges, you can click Show at the right end of the bar for the teacher to
 expand details.
- Each recommendation letter and evaluation will show one of the following three statuses:
 - Request Pending: The recommender has been requested to submit an evaluation or recommendation which has not been submitted yet.
 - Request Fulfilled: The recommender has submitted the requested evaluation or recommendation, which has been transmitted to the destination institution(s).
 - Declined: The recommender has been requested to submit an evaluation and has declined to do so.
 Another recommender will need to be selected by changing the evaluation request.





Scholarsip/Financial Aid Resources

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

All students/families should fill out the FAFSA (even if you don't think you'll qualify for grants) as soon as possible after it becomes available in *December this year*. You need to fill out the FAFSA to be eligible for federal financial aid but also, some schools require you to have a FAFSA on file just to receive their scholarships. Also, you never know when your financial situation may change between now and when you start college. It is best to have this application on file just in case.

On or as soon as possible in December, go to: fafsa.gov

If you need assistance, you may contact the Financial Aid Dept. at any college/university you are applying to. Also, plan on attending the info. meeting at NHS Monday, November 6th.

CSS Profile

Some colleges and universities use the CSS Profile to award financial aid. This is an online application used by colleges, universities and scholarship programs to award non-federal financial aid such as grants and scholarships. The CSS Profile is a separate application from the FAFSA and should be completed in addition to the FAFSA not in place of the FAFSA. The application is available October 1st each year. https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/

Merit Scholarships - From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To

Merit scholarships are often related to academic performance, but can also be given to a candidate displaying artistic or athletic excellence, or even a combination of both. While all academic scholarships are merit scholarships, not all merit scholarships are academic.

Often all you have to do is apply to the school to be considered for merit scholarships to attend that school. You'll automatically be considered (typically GPA, test scores on ACT/SAT, and/or class rank) once you submit your college application. However, some schools do require an additional application Do your research to find out and also be mindful of deadlines!

Also, make sure you check the college/university website directly for any additional scholarships they offer that require a separate application and deadline. Many schools advertise additional scholarships in this way.

<u>Website Scholarships</u> – From Colleges/Universities You're Applying To You should carefully research the website from all schools you are applying to. They may have additional scholarships listed that you can apply for separately.

<u>Local Scholarships - Nordonia Students Only</u>

Local scholarships will be introduced to all current Nordonia High School seniors during the month of February. Students will be able to access the application materials online and must submit all printed copies to the Guidance Office. More information and deadlines to come.



OSDAR Wings of Eagles Scholarship **Application Due January 31st, 2024**

OSDAR awards scholarships to graduating high school seniors. Including those completing a certified home school program, in the amount of \$1,000 each. Awards are based on academic excellence and character. All applicants must be citizens of the United States, legal residents of the state of Ohio and will be attending an accredited college or university in the United States. Awards are placed on deposit with the college or university, and any unused portion shall be returned to OSDAR. No affiliation or relationship with DAR is necessary, however all applicants must obtain a letter of sponsorship from their local DAR chapter. Only applications completed correctly and submitted in one entry will be considered. Applications must be submitted through the sponsoring chapter. Scholarships are awarded without regard to race, religion, sex, national origin, or disability. Only winners will be notified.

<u>Instructions</u>: All certified transcripts, letters of recommendation and other required documents must be received by the state chairman by the deadline in one online submission. Do not submit a personal photograph!

List of required documents:

- 1. Letter from sponsoring chapter. You can find a local Ohio chapter online by visiting the chapter locator at https://www.dar.org/national-society/become-member/chapter-locations.
- 2. Official certified transcript of high school grade which also indicates class rank/size and test scores unless home schooled. Home schooled students include grade transcripts for grade 9 through current year and documented test scores.
- 3. An essay of 500 words or less. Topic: If you were asked to "Continue the Legacy of our American Patriots" what would that mean to you and how would you do that? (Word count must show on essay.) Essay must be submitted in Arial 11 font.
- 4. A statement of 200 words or less describing what makes you an outstanding candidate for the scholarship. (Word count must show on statement.) Statement must be submitted in Arial 11 font.
- 5. A list of extra-curricular activities, honors received, scholastic achievements, or other significant accomplishments (Max, length one page, one column, one side equivalent to an $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ page). Must be submitted in Arial 11 font.
- 6. Dated and signed letters of recommendation from at least three but not more than four people in authority from

the high school or college the applicant currently attends, who are familiar with the applicant's work. Letter may cover the applicant's ability, work habits, integrity, character, potential and activities. Each letter must include the title, address and telephone number of the person giving the recommendation for possible contact or verification.

- 7. Proof of United States Citizenship: birth certificate or naturalization papers. NOTE: cover the photograph when photocopying naturalization papers.
- 8. Application must be submitted to your local DAR chapter no later than 11:59PM January 31, 2024.
- 9. LOCAL DAR CHAPTER MUST SUBMIT APPLICATION TO mechase 1960@gmail.com Application and supporting paperwork MUST be submitted in one scan/attachment, NOT individually.


