# PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETING COLLEGE APPLICATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Complete all steps in order to avoid delays in processing your applications

**STEP 1: Apply** - Complete the college application using **ONE** method below (note; use a personal email NOT your NHS email for your applications. Communication from outside organizations are blocked by the District).

• Online application - Access the application directly from the college website

# OR

- Common App- Some Colleges are CommonApp exclusive and some give you the option to use the CommonApp or their own online applications.
- Register for an account at www.commonapp.org
- \*Please Note: You will notice that the schools ask for a Counselor Recommendation, this is not the same as requesting a letter of recommendation. I will complete and send the Common Ap Counselor Rec. Form and School Report automatically for all Common Apps you submit.
- Check for the following for each college: application fee, deadline, essay, # of recommendations required/optional, separate scholarship or honors applications required, etc.

STEP 2: Sending Materials (completed through Schoolinks - login through Clever)

# **College Application Manager in SchooLinks:**

Using the "Colleges" tab on the left hand side of your screen, select "College Applications" from the list.

- 1. The first time you use the College Application Manager, you will complete the FERPA waiver for SchooLinks and enter your personal information (address, phone number, personal email).
- 2. For each college you'd like to apply to (that is not CommonApp), you'll need to set up an application and its requirements follow the steps below to add applications to your College Application Manager.
  - 3. You will also need to fill your personal details, and FERPA Waiver in the designated sections.

# **Common App Colleges:**

- Connect your Common App to SchooLinks. Once logged in to SchooLinks, in the College Application Manager, click the blue "connect" button under the Common App icon, follow prompts to connect accounts
  - Your applications on Common App will automatically be added to the dashboard. If you've submitted your applications, they will appear under the "Completed & Pending" column. If your applications have not been submitted, they will appear under the "Incomplete" column.
- Once you submit your application, you MUST visit Ms. Volin in Support Services

### **Non-Common App Colleges:**

From your application dashboard follow these instructions to add colleges you're applying to:

- Click on + Add application in the upper right hand corner to look up a college
- Search and find the correct college and campus you are applying to
- Once you've selected the college application you want to add, choose an application status: You will
  choose "Completed & Pending" (because you should have submitted your application already)
- Click the blue button in the bottom right "Add Application"
- Select "Application Method": select the method you have decided to apply through, examples:

### LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

From your College Application dashboard, select a college application by clicking on the pencil icon



Teacher recommendation requests are located in the middle column of the individual college's application page. There will be details regarding the college's recommendation requirements. If there are no required letters, it may still give you the option to submit an optional recommendation.

## To add an optional recommendation follow these steps:

- Click on the + sign next to "Request Teacher Evaluation"
- Search and select the teacher/staff member or locate them in the list provided and hit "Next"
- Check the information is accurate for the teacher you are inviting to complete a recommendation letter. Select the Subject area they teach or select other if it is not a traditional teacher.
- Create a custom message to the teacher regarding what college(s) you're applying to, anything you would ask them to highlight, let them know if you've completed the brag sheet.
- Click "Submit Request" and follow up with the teacher in person.

## Required recommendation letters:

- Click the + next to "Add Recommender" (there will be a red exclamation mark that says "required" in a red box indicating that you must submit at least one letter of recommendation).
  - Follow the steps above to complete the recommendation request.
    - \*\*please provide AT LEAST a 2 week notice when inviting teachers to complete a letter of rec\*\*

### Complete Senior Bragging Rights in SchooLinks

- Log in to SchooLinks through Clever
- Click on the "Careers" tab on the left hand side and select "My Profile/Resume"
- Click on each section (My Story, Experience, Bragging Rights, & Academics) across the top. Be sure to



Congresswoman Sykes is excited to announce the opening of the Congressional App Challenge (CAC), an app competition for students in middle and high school.

The CAC accepts computer programs (or apps) written in any programming language, for any platform (desktop/PC, web, mobile, raspberry Pi, etc.). The Challenge's submission portal is now open. Students can register and submit their applications until November 1st, 2021. The competition is open to all students who meet the eligibility requirements, regardless of coding experience. We strongly encourage students of all skill levels to participate and learn how to create their own apps. Winners will be selected by panels of judges drawn from the local community and honored by their Member of Congress. Their apps are eligible to be featured on display in the U.S. Capitol building, on <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/journal.org/">house.gov</a> and on the Congressional App Challenge website.

The CAC was created because Congress recognized that STEM and computer-based skills are essential for economic growth and innovation and that the U.S. has been falling behind on these fronts. By some estimates, the U.S. may be short by as many as 1 million programmers by 2021. These are high-paying, high-demand jobs. To maintain American competitiveness, it's crucial that the United States invests in our youth now and helps them acquire these valuable skills. The CAC encourages students to pursue those skills and recognizes them for their efforts.

# 3 tips for making the most of your visit:

- 1. Review the list of attending colleges to narrow down where you want to spend your time.
- 2. Prepare a list of questions that will help you with your decision:
- -What are the most popular majors?
- -How much is tuition?
- -Are scholarships available?
- -What is the ratio of professors to students?
- -What are the student housing options?
- -What is student life like during the week? During the weekend?
- **3. Pre-print address labels** that include your name, address, telephone number, high school, and graduation year to stick on request for information cards to eliminate having to re-write your name and address at every table you visit. If you include an email address, we recommend using your personal email address. High schools may disable your high school email address upon graduation.



# JFSA COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID PROGRAM



JFSA administers scholarships, grants, and interest-free loans to students in the greater Cleveland area enrolled in accredited institutions of higher education.

Scholarships are awarded in competition with other students who have met application requirements. Some scholarships are renewable. Grants and loans are based on need and available funds. Funds may be used toward tuition and education fees. All students must reapply each year.

# **Eligibility Guidelines\***

- High school senior, college undergraduate, or graduate student who identifies as Jewish
- · Full time student
- Attending an accredited 4-year college (no online programs)
- Resident of Cuyahoga, Summit, Portage, Geauga, Medina or Lorain counties
- Has applied to or exhausted other sources and still needs additional finances to complete education
- Family gross income up to \$225,000
- 2.5 GPA minimum

\*Eligibility guidelines vary by individual scholarship.





# **Eligibility requirements:**

- Are currently enrolled in a school located in Northeast Ohio

- Plan to enroll in a two-year or 4-year college in 2024-2025
- Earned a 2.5 cumulative grade point average through junior year of high school
- 18 ACT or a 960 on the math and verbal portions of the SAT \*\*The ACT or SAT must be taken by September 30 2023\*\*
- Plan to major in areas that could lead to a career working in education or for a professional sports organization, such as but not limited to: accounting, business, communications, event management, exercise science, finance, graphic design, human resources, information technology, journalism, kinesiology, marketing/advertising, public relations, or sports management.
- Meet specific income guidelines based on the Parent's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI)

# **Miami University Bridges Program**

Miami University is proud to present the Bridges Program, which was founded 40 years ago by Black students who wanted a Miami degree to be more accessible to students from diverse backgrounds and to ensure that their experiences here would be rewarding. The Bridges Program is an engaging experience that provides an inside look at Miami University to prospective students. This program invites high-achieving high school seniors from historically underrepresented populations, as well as students who have a commitment to promoting a deeper understanding of and appreciation for diversity, to engage with our current students, faculty, and staff. The program attracts students who represent various diverse identities — racial/ethnic, sexual orientation and gender identity, and socioeconomic.

# **Application**

We encourage you to <u>apply for the Bridges Program</u>. Students accepted to the Bridges Program usually meet the following application criteria:

- High school students graduating in 2024
- Minimum of 3.00 GPA on a 4.00 scale or top 25% of graduating class
- Rigorous curriculum
- Demonstrated leadership/co-curricular involvement

Test scores (PLAN, ACT, SAT, PSAT) are NOT require

Application Deadline: September 25, 2023

Bridges Program Scholarship:

Students who complete the Bridges Program and enroll on the Oxford campus for Fall 2022 will be eligible to receive the **Bridges Program scholarship.**

scholarship a student must:

A) Be planning to attend an accredited college or university within the United States by the Fall of 2024. B) Be a US Citizen or a valid US Visa holder.
